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CLIMATE OUTLOOK FOR SUMMER 2016 IN SERBIA

Most of Serbia is expected to experience averagely warm summer, and in southern parts of the country, marginally warmer compared to the average values. Climate outlooks indicate the highest positive temperature departure in August. The mean summer temperatures are expected to range between 21°C and 25°C.

The number of tropical days (the maximum air temperature above 30°C) in June, July and August will be in a range from 20 to 40, and in the hilly-mountainous areas around 4 days. The expected number of tropical nights (the minimum air temperature above 20°C) for Belgrade is approximately 20, while, elsewhere, that number will vary from 2 to 10, not counting hilly-mountainous regions.

Precipitation sums are expected to be near-multiannual average in most of Serbia. Climate outlooks indicate marginal precipitation deficit in July. The mean summer precipitation sums are expected to range between 50 mm and 70 mm, locally reaching 85 mm. It should be noted that despite these conditions, there is a chance that mountain areas sporadically receive more precipitation, due to the development of convective cloudiness and occurrence of intensive showers.

Summer of 2016 is not likely to be extremely warm and dry as the previous summer.
